Albany Medical College Receives Excellent Results During Match Day

One hundred percent of the graduating medical students at Albany Medical College learned that they were successfully "matched" to residency positions throughout the country during National Match Day on March 17.

Albany Medical College students were matched to such prestigious institutions as Johns Hopkins, Yale-New Haven University, the Cleveland Clinic and Duke University Medical Center, to name a few.

"The class of 2005 continues Albany Medical College's tradition of matching its students to some of the top institutions across the country," said Henry Pohl, M.D., vice dean for academic



administration. "Each year, our match results recognize the quality of our students and the education they receive at the medical college."

On Match Day, fourth-year medical students from across the country, including 122 at Albany Medical College, learned where they would perform their advanced medical training. The Albany Medical College students gathered in the Albany Law School gymnasium and excitedly opened the envelopes that contained the news they were waiting for – the name of the institution where they will receive their advanced training after receiving their medical degree from the college this May.

Residency assignments begin in July. The ceremony was held at the law school gym to accommodate the large number of students and family members who attend.

Fourth-year medical students apply to several residency programs in a specific specialty, while residency programs rank the students they have interviewed. The students then are matched by computer by the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP). A resident is a physician who has graduated from medical school and is undergoing specialized training in a medical specialty.

During this year's match, Albany Medical Center Hospital filled 98 percent of its available first-year residency positions. Albany Med's residency programs



in anesthesiology, emergency medicine, family practice, general surgery, internal medicine, medicine/pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, orthopedic surgery, pathology, pediatrics, physical medicine and rehabilitation, plastic surgery, preliminary surgery, psychiatry and radiology all participate in the NRMP.

Except for graduation day, Match Day is the biggest event in a medical student's academic life.

Fourteen students from this year's class will perform their residencies at Albany Medical Center Hospital, while 29 students total were matched to programs in New York state. Nearly half of this year's class – 48 percent – is entering into primary care specialties, including family practice, internal medicine, medicine/pediatrics, pediatrics and obstetrics and gynecology.

Sen. Joseph L. Bruno to speak at Albany College of Pharmacy's 125th commencement

New York State Senate Majority Leader Joseph L. Bruno will deliver the commencement address in May during Albany College of Pharmacy's 125th graduation ceremonies, President James J. Gozzo, Ph.D., has announced.

Sen. Bruno also will receive an honorary doctorate degree during the ceremonies Sunday, May 8 at 2 p.m. at the Empire State Plaza Convention Center.

"We are honored that Senator Bruno has accepted our invitation to address the graduates of the Class of 2005," Dr. Gozzo said. "Our 125th commencement ceremonies will mark an important milestone for the college, and we are pleased to have such a distinguished speaker to help us celebrate this occasion."

First elected to the Senate in 1976, Sen. Bruno (R-Brunswick) was elected majority leader in January 1995 and subsequently reelected by his colleagues in 1997, 1999, 2001, 2003 and this year. As a legislative priority, he has highlighted the state's economy and has concentrated his efforts on ways to stimulate economic development, make New York more competitive with other states and create jobs, particularly in the areas of high technology and biotechnology.
